What is a Confined Space?



OSHA defines a confined space as an area that has limited openings for entry or exit, is large enough for entering and working, and is not designed for continuous occupancy.








WHAT IS A PERMIT-REQUIRED CONFINED SPACE?

Permit-required confined spaces meet all of the criteria for confined spaces, plus one or more of the following characteristics:

- Contains, or has the potential to contain, a hazardous atmosphere
- Contains material that has the potential to engulf an entrant
- Has walls that converge inward or floors that slope downward and taper to a smaller area that could trap or asphyxiate an entrant
- Contains any other recognized safety or health hazard such as unguarded machinery, exposed live wires, or heat stress
